SPRINGFIELD MASS. TRIP, JAN. 26-27-28, 2018

Each year the Club goes to the Amherst Railway Society Eastern States Exposition held at 1305 Memorial Avenue, West Springfield, MA. We leave Dover on Friday morning, January 26, arrive in Springfield late afternoon and spend Saturday the 27th and part of the 28th at the show and return home Sunday evening. There are four super big buildings at the show. The Better Living Center, the Young Building, the Stroh Building and the Mallary Complex. There are over 400 vendors and at least 30 layouts to see. We will have 8 rooms reserved at the Sheraton Springfield Monarch Place Hotel at One Monarch Place, Springfield, MA. Normally we have 6 couples and a couple of singles to share rooms. The price is \$320.00 per couple and \$170.00 for singles. The price includes the room for 2 nights, travel there and back and pre-arranged arm bands for Saturday and Sunday admission to the train show. We leave Dover around 8:30 A.M. Friday January 26. First stop is around 9:30 at the Fenwick Rest Stop on the Turnpike. Second and last stop is around noon on the Garden State Parkway. We should arrive at the Sheraton around 4 or 5 P.M. 
